ENTRY REQUIREMENTS / TRAVEL CHECKLIST

- 1 Indian citizens: visa-exempt (no visa required) until 31 December 2026 (per Malaysian Immigration Department).
- 2 If your planned duration of stay will exceed 1 month, a visa is required (general rule stated on the page).
- 3 Yellow Fever Vaccination Certificate must be presented on arrival if you are arriving from or have transited through a country at risk of yellow fever infection — check the Ministry of Health (MOH) list before travel.

Processing / application note

Visa exemption for Indian citizens explicitly time-limited: valid until 31 December 2026 (as stated on the source page).
